Chairman Kevin Austin welcomed the PTRC Board of Delegates and called the meeting to order at 12:04pm via Zoom and in person attendance. Mr. Austin welcomed guests including Ms. Marikay Abuzuaiter's husband, Isa. and Mr. Larry Davis from the City of Greensboro (via ZOOM). Chairman Austin requested a moment of silence and then led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

- 1. Presentation: Presentation: Jordan Lake One Water Vision, Ms. Emily Barrett, Natural Resources & Resilience Program Manager, Triangle J Council of Governments
  - a. Ms. Emily Barrett explained that Jordan Lake One Water (JLOW) is a partnership to facilitate cooperation and integrated water resource management in the Jordan Lake watershed.
  - b. The group is comprised of local governments, conservation groups, universities, water utilities, agriculture, and private industry stakeholders interested in sharing the cost of water quality and quantity improvements in order to realize watershed-wide societal, economic, and environmental benefits.
  - c. One Water principles share the mindset that all water has value. It is also a systems approach to focus on achieving multiple benefits.
  - d. Ms. Barrett showed a map of the area that falls in the Jordan Lake watershed which includes about four counties. She also showed the water intake map which covers approximately seven counties.
  - e. There is federal level support for this project including Radhika Fox with the Office of Water, ESEPA and Michael Regan at USEPA.
  - f. JLOW seeks resilient water utilities, thriving places, competitive business and industry, robust agriculture, social and economic inclusion and healthy ecosystems.
  - g. The goals have been simplified down to:
    - **i.** Goal 1 (Environmental) To improve the hydrological, geological, and ecological function of the Jordan Lake watershed.
    - **ii.** Goal 2 (Societal) To enhance the health, vitality, and well-being of the citizens and communities within the Jordan Lake watershed.
    - **iii.** Goal 3 (Economic) To foster a robust, prosperous, and viable economy in the Jordan Lake watershed.
  - h. Six work groups have worked together to come up with a two-part plan. Part one is to form a transitional JLOW organization. Part two is to co-develop a framework for collaboration between JLOW and the NCDEQ to address regulatory concerns including nutrient requirements.
  - i. JLOW aspires to not add to existing obligations, but offer ways to get better results with no additional costs. JLOW also strives to make sure that water quality improvements are linked with things voters care about on a day to day basis.
  - j. Next steps for JLOW include developing a path to create a "founding member" level of investment for communities for FY23 and to work with DEQ on the Jordan Lake Rules advocating for he approach outlined here.

- a. Request for approval to enter into the two contracts totaling \$3,250 for professional planning and GIS services with Thomasville and Caswell County

# 4. NEW BUSINESS Action Item: Request for approval to accept the awarded HUD \$1,000,000 Weatherization Coordination Demonstration Grant Program, Mr. Michael Blair, Community Development Director

- a. The Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has awarded the PTRC, as a direct grant recipient, \$1,000,000 to partner with City of Greensboro's Lead-Safe Housing Program, University of North Carolina at Greensboro Center for Housing & Community Studies, North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University Center for Energy Research and Technology, North Carolina Justice Center, and the North Carolina State Energy Program to implement a collaborative program to address housing issues of low-income families related to lead-based paint, healthy homes, and energy efficiency and weatherization. The PTRC is one of only five applicants nationwide to receive an award this round.
- b. The program will implement a protocol that includes joint applications, inspections/assessments and intervention measures that will reduce the burden on applicants to navigate multiple agencies for these services.
- c. The grant will include 20 homes that will receive services that have members of households living in units that include either a young child (age 6 or under), an elderly person (age 62 or over), a pregnant woman, or a person with a disability or illness that could benefit from home modification (e.g., poorly controlled asthma, Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD)) or the household has a high energy burden.
- d. Mr. Fleming El-Amin asked why Forsyth was not included. Mr. Blair answered that they did not have a current lead grant and that made them ineligible. It is the same for High Point and Burlington.
- e. Request for approval to accept the awarded HUD \$1,000,000 Weatherization Coordination Demonstration Grant Program
