Housing

GOAL

- To ensure quality housing and safe neighborhoods while providing a variety of housing options that enhances the natural environments of the town.

H1. Encourage the restoration & preservation of historic residential properties.

H2. Encourage conservation subdivision design for new developments.

- To promote a strong, diversified and sustainable local economy that meets the daily needs of residents while respecting the natural and cultural environment and enhancing the quality of life in the community.

ED1. Improve cooperation, communication, and coordination among all levels of government.

ED2. Improve the appearance of the downtown area.

ED3. Work to retain existing local businesses in town.

ED4. Attract visitors to Pleasant Garden by having some destination attractions and not just being a means to get to another place.



Transportation

GOAL

- To ensure a safe and effective transportation network that efficiently moves traffic, provides both local and regional access, is environmentally sensitive, and encourages alternative modes of transportation while minimizing disruption to existing roads.

T1. Participate in regional transportation and public transit planning.

T2. Ensure that new development improves and does not negatively impact the existing transportation network

T3. Develop an alternative network for pedestrian and bicycle movement.

T4. Establish a method for keeping Pleasant Garden's roads maintained in the future.
