Town Government

Mocksville operates under the Council-Manager form of government, with an elected Town Board who appoints the Town Manager to serve as the Chief Administrative Officer.

Town Board

The Board of Commissioners is comprised of five members elected atlarge and one elected Mayor, all of whom are elected in non-partisan elections. The Mayor and Board members are elected to serve four-year, staggered terms.

The Board is responsible for the administration of the Town. Under the Town Charter and the laws of the State of North Carolina, the Board is charged with passing ordinances, policies, and the annual budget.

The Board of Commissioners serves as the Board of Adjustment and makes appointments to various other boards including the Planning Board, the Tourism Development Authority, and the Tree Board.

Town Manager Position


Mocksville's Manager is retiring after 35 years as a public servant in communities across the Piedmont Triad. The Council appreciates and supports the role of Town Manager. The successful manager needs to be a good communicator with the staff and board. They will need a strong understanding of municipal finances and the ability to plug into all of the social aspects of smalltown living. The Town is experiencing exponential growth in both commercial and residential development. The Town needs someone that can work with the various government agencies and the Town Board to promote growth and maintain a "small town" atmosphere. Core components of this work are the updating of both the zoning ordinance and comprehensive plan over the next two years. That process of consensus building, information sharing, and visioning requires effective facilitation and guidance by the Town Manager. A focal point of this community growth is the development of a 5+ acre parcel in downtown Mocksville.

A successful candidate must demonstrate skills in leadership, administration, budgeting, and economic development as applied in a municipal management setting. The successful candidate will have the ability to communicate and effectively represent the Town publicly while positively engaging citizens.

The Town seeks an experienced public administrator with 5 years of progressive experience, including three years of senior organizational management experience, preferably in NC municipal administration. This experience should include directing diverse local government services and supervising staff.

The basic desired qualifications include a bachelor degree in finance, business, or public administration. A candidate may distinguish themselves with a master's degree. Mocksville places an emphasis on the Town Manager being a member of the International City and County Management Association (ICMA) and the North Carolina City and County Management Association (NCCCMA). The Board supports and encourages the Manager to be or become an ICMA credentialed manager within a reasonable period of being employed.

Residency within Davie County within one (1) year of being hired is an expectation with a preference for residency within the Town.

- Demonstrates leadership qualities to problemsolve and increase effectiveness in the organization.
- Exhibits communication skills to pull external partners and stakeholders into collaborative work with the Town.
- Has a proven history of community engagement through civic/non-profit/religious organizations in other communities where they have served.
- Has experience and ability to manage diverse municipal operations according to North Carolina administrative practices.
- Has facilitation and communication skills to develop a common vision of municipal service, gain consensus and buy-in to that vision, and the energy and drive to execute that vision.
