The Carolina Mountain Land Conservancy recently distributed a Request For Proposals for administrative and engineering services that will allow them to be eligible for US EPA 319 watershed plan implementation funds and satisfy a Surface Water Supply Protection grant they received from the NC Clean Water Management Trust Fund. The PTRC Planning Department was contacted by Jewell Engineering Consultants, P.C., of Kernersville, NC, to partner with them on a proposal to fully respond to the RFP to ensure that CMLC will meet federal and state requirements. The PTRC was contacted due to its experience on other watershed planning efforts throughout the region, and, if awarded will provide administrative services for the project.

The Mills River watershed is located in the French Broad River Basin in Transylvania and Henderson County. The Land-Of-Sky Council of Governments is not pursuing this project, and supports our involvement with the proposed project. The proposed project cost is approximately \$39,000, and will support time for two PTRC employees. If awarded funding, the staff will return to the Board of Delegates to receive authorization to contract with Jewell Engineering Consultants, P.C.

The US EPA allocates funds annually to Lead Regional Organizations to address water quality needs through planning and administrative services. The 2013 Request For Proposals was announced in July 2013. Funds total \$97,200 to be distributed statewide and proposals are due to the NC Division of Water Resources September 17, 2013. Following internal discussion, the leading project candidates are:

- 1) Enhancing the Elkin Water Supply Plan grant project to a more fully-realized nineelement local watershed plan;
- 2) A Stormwater Small Area Plan for the Uptown Lexington District; or
- 3) Initiating and support the creation of a Dan River Basin water quality monitoring network.

The PTRC Planning Department staff requests authorization to apply for one project for no more than \$25,000. No cash contributions will be required, although 205j funds only support 10.8% of indirect costs.

The Piedmont triad Regional Council (PTRC) was formed on July 1, 2011, by the combination of the Northwest Piedmont Council of Governments and the Piedmont Triad Council of Governments. This twelve-co8unty region has a combined history of over forty years of operation and is a local government under the provisions of the NCGS 160-A and is governed by the fiscal provisions of the State of North Carolina under NCGS 159.

The PTRC is constructing a central office building at 1398 Carrollton Crossing, Kernersville, NC in order to house the consolidated offices of the two Council of Governments. The purpose of the installment loan is to acquire Low voltage wiring and other associated improvements to the property as allowed by GS 160A-475.

The PTRC is inviting your proposal on this installment loan and to offer your lowest interest rate with the following conditions:

- The amount of the loan is \$350,000. The PTRC plans to commit 20% from our fund balance in support of this loan.
- 2. The desired term is five years.
- The interest rate is to be fixed for the term and calculated on a 365-day basis. The proceeds from this loan will qualify for tax-exempt status. Interest rates should reflect quotes for bank qualified only.
- PTRC prefers to have the right to prepay the loan in whole or in part at anytime without penalty.
- 5. A commitment for the loan will be needed by September 3, 2013. Final closing may take place after that date.
- The successful bidder will be required to submit all appropriate documents to successfully close this loan.
- 7. All additional costs associated with this loan should be listed.

Matthew and David - As David knows, I just heard from Ms. Millonzi at the UNC School of Government. She confirms that Option B that I wrote her about last week, after talking with Mr. Mcgilvray at the LGC, is a feasible way to finance the low voltage wiring.

To recap: There is a specific statute that allows local governments to finance real or personal property by means of an installment contract that takes a security interest in the property. This is GS 160A-20(h) which I wrote about earlier. It identifies 20 kinds of local government entities as eligible under this provision, but not COGs. That was Option A. (See Note at end)

I contacted Ms. Millonzi again and outlined Option B -- using GS 160A-475 to support financing of the low voltage project. GS 160A-475 is the statute under which the original loan for the property and building was structured and approved by the LGC. It states in part:

"160A-475. Specific powers of council

The charter may confer on the regional council any of the following powers: . . .

(7a) For the purpose of meeting the regional council's office space and program needs, to acquire real property by purchase, gift, or otherwise, and to improve that property. The regional council may pledge real property as security for indebtedness used to finance acquisition of that property or for improvements to that real property, subject to approval of the Local Government Commission as required under GS 159-153."

We now all concur that the low voltage wiring may be financed under this section of 106A-475 for an amount less than \$500,000 over a 3-5 year period.

- PTRC already has a 160A-475 installment contract for the purchase of land and construction of the building approved by the LGC.
- Low voltage wiring can be considered an "improvement" to the property as provided by the statute

Thus, as long as the wiring is an improvement to the real property, the COG should be able to structure a loan to finance all or a portion of the cost of the wiring and to pledge the property as security under GS 160A-475.

<u>Note</u>: I also referred to an advisory letter from the Attorney General that says COGs can perform services for local governments for certain limited purposes. But that is limited to the provision of services (such as GIS) authorized by its member governments - not purchasing of property or improvements.
