

Proclamation

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Energy's Weatherization Assistance Program was created in 1976 to assist low-income families who lacked resources to invest in energy efficiency; and

WHEREAS, the Weatherization Assistance Program helps low-income North Carolinians save energy and reduce their utility bills. The program is administered through the N.C. Energy office in the NC Department of Environment and Natural Resources; and

WHEREAS, Piedmont Triad Regional Council of Governments was awarded the grant in 2012 to improve energy efficiency, household safety and educate the public about maintaining energy efficiency. The program puts special emphasis on the elderly, the disabled, families with children, high energy users and the energy burdened; and

WHEREAS, Weatherization Day was conceived as a means to focus local, state and national attention on the program and the work being performed by dedicated members of the Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) network; and

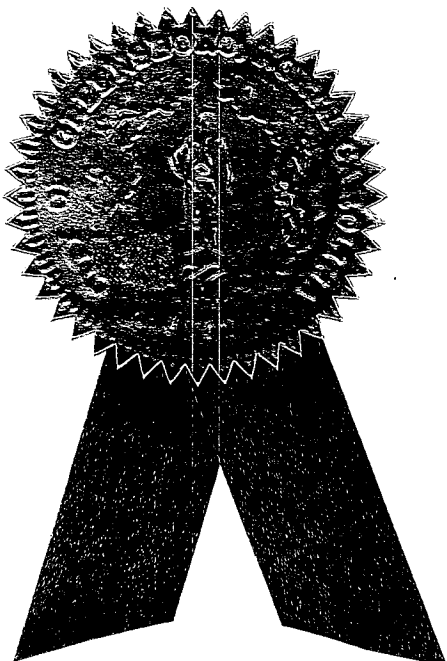


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Robert V. Perkins, Mayor of the City of Greensboro do hereby proclaim October 30, 2013 as
