ACTION ITEM IV: TCC BYLAWS RECOMMENDATIONS

ACTION REQUESTED: Consideration of TCC Recommendation

After a special meeting regarding RPO bylaws, the TCC voted during the November 12th meeting to recommend the following changes to the TCC Bylaws:

Motion #1: 4 in favor, 2 opposed

- Add YVEDDI representative as a voting member
- Add an aviation representative as an ex-officio member
- Change the following positions from voting members to ex-officio/non-voting members: 1) Executive Director, NWPCOG (PTRC), 2) Chief Planner, NWPCOG (PTRC), 3) NCDOT RPO Coordinator, Statewide Planning Branch.

Motion #2: All in favor

- Add PART representative as voting member

Northwest Piedmont Rural Planning Organization Transportation Coordinating Committee By-Laws

ARTICLE I-NAME

The name of this committee shall be the Northwest Piedmont Transportation Planning Coordinating Committee (NWPTCC), hereinafter referred to as the NWPTCC.

ARTICLE II-PURPOSE

The purpose and goals of this committee shall be to:

- To advise and assist the Northwest Piedmont Transportation Advisory Committee (NWPTAC) on regional planning and policy decisions.
- To support and review the work of the local and state transportation staff.
- Receive and review comment from County Advisory Committee (CAC).
- To assist in the accomplishment of NWPTAC goals.

ARTICLE III-MEMBERS

Section 1-Memberhsip:

As specified in the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), the NWPTCC shall include technical representatives of all local and state government agencies directly related to the transportation goals of the Northwest Piedmont Rural Planning Organization. Initial membership shall include, but may not be limited to:

- 1. The county manager from each member county.
- 2. The chief administrative official from each municipal member.
- The executive director and chief planner from the Northwest Piedmont Council of Governments.
- 4. The Division Engineers of the North Carolina Department of Transportation serving each county member.

The initial voting membership shall include the following members:

- County Managers from Davie, Stokes, Surry, and Yadkin Counties or their designee
- Municipal Manager or Administrator from member municipalities or their designee
- NC-DOT RPO Coordinator, Statewide Planning Branch
- NC-DOT Regional Traffic Engineer
- NC-DOT Division 11, Engineer
- NC-DOT Division 9, Engineer
- Executive Director, NWPCOG
- Chief Planner, NWPCOG

The non-voting representative shall include the following members:

- A representative from the Winston-Salem Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO).
- A representative from the Town of Bermuda Run.
- A representative from the City of King.

Other local agencies, citizens, and organizations can file a request for membership to the NWPTCC. Membership can be either voting or non-voting as determined by the NWPTAC. Membership to the NWPTCC may be altered only by a majority vote of the NWPTAC.

Section 2-Alternates:

Each member may appoint an alternate to its representative, provided each alternate also meets the same qualifications of membership. That alternate may serve as a full voting member during any meeting where that board's representative is not in attendance. Proxy and absentee voting may not be permitted.

Section 3-Term of Membership:

Because membership is based upon continued participation in the Northwest Piedmont Rural Planning Organization, NWPTCC membership will be continuous until such time that the County, Municipality, or State Agency no longer is a member of the NWPRPO. New NWPTCC membership or replacement of representatives of members will be based on the procedures as described within these by-laws.

ARTICLE IV-OFFICERS

Section 1-Officers Defined:

The officers of the NWPTCC will consist of a Chairman and a Vice-Chairman serving annual terms. A NWPTCC member can serve an unlimited number of terms as an officer, but is limited to serving only two consecutive terms at any one level. The Lead Planning Agency will appoint a staff member to serve as Secretary.

Section 2-Duties of Officers:

The Chairman shall call meetings of the NWPTCC to order and shall act as Chairman of such meetings. The Chairman shall see that all orders and action items, including amendments, are carried into effect. The Chairman will:

- Sign all official documents of the NWPTCC.
- Preside at all meetings of the NWPTCC.
- Decide all points of order or procedure.
- Present all recommendations of the NWPTCC to the NWPTAC.
- Advise Lead Planning Agency staff of meeting agenda items.

The Vice-Chairman shall conduct the duties of the Chairman in the event of the Chairman's absence.

The administrative coordination for the NWPTCC shall be performed by the NWPRPO staff, as Secretary, who shall report to the Chairman of the NWPTCC. The Secretary shall:

- Keep minutes of the NWPTCC meetings in proper form for the approval of the NWPTCC at its next regular meeting.
- Mail notices of regular meetings of the NWPTCC, with a copy of the agenda, in accordance with Article V of these rules.
- Give notice of special meetings called in accordance with NC Open Meeting Law.
- Maintain all files, records, and correspondence of the NWPTCC.

Should neither the Chairman nor Vice-Chairman be able to preside at a meeting, the Secretary shall appoint a Chairman for that meeting only or until such time the Chairman or Vice-Chairman can resume their responsibilities. The Lead Planning Agency shall ensure that the Secretary or a qualified substitute attends every NWPTCC meeting.

ARTICLE V-MEETINGS

Section 1-Regular Meetings:

Meetings will be held on the third Tuesday of every other month prior to the NWPTAC meeting. Meeting notices and agendas are to be mailed or sent via electronic mail in sufficient time for them to have been received by each committee member, no later than seven (7) days prior to the meeting date. Unless otherwise stated, all meetings will begin at 3:30 PM. Regular meetings may be canceled by the Chairman should there be insufficient material to cover on the NWPTCC's tentative agenda.

Section 2-Special Meetings:

Special meetings may be called by the Chairman, or at the request of the eligible voting members petitioning the Chairman. Whenever possible, at least seven (7) days notice shall be given.

Section 3-Workshops:

The NWPTCC may choose to hold workshops from time to time. Notices for all workshops shall be sent in the same manner as regular meetings of the NWPTCC.

Section 4-Attendance:

Each member organization shall be expected to send their representative to each regular meeting and each special meeting provided at least seven (7) days notice is given.

A majority of the NWPTCC may recommend to the NWPTAC the removal from membership of any member who fails to attend, or make arrangements for an alternate to attend, five (5) or more meetings on a one (1) year period. Such recommendations shall be forwarded to the appointing agency or governmental unit.

Section 5-Agenda:

The agenda is a list of considerations for discussion at a meeting. Any member of the NWPTCC can place items on the agenda prior to its distribution. Additional items may be placed on the regular agenda following discussion of the last item on the regular agenda, as long as a majority concurrence of the present and eligible voting members is received.

Section 6-Voting Procedures:

The Chairman may call for a vote on any issue, provided that it is seconded and within the purposes set forth in Article II and provided the issue is on the agenda as outlined in Section 5 of this article. Each voting member of the NWPTCC shall have one (1) vote. A majority vote of the members (or their authorized alternates) present and eligible to vote shall be sufficient for approval of matters coming before the NWPTCC. The Chairman is permitted to vote. Abstentions shall be considered affirmative votes. By approval of the NWPTCC, a member may withdraw from voting on an issue. In the absence of any direction from these By-Laws or other duly adopted voting procedures pursuant to certain approval actions, Robert's Rules of Order will designate procedures governing voting.

ARTICLE VI-AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAWS

Amendments to these By-Laws of the NWPTCC shall require the affirmative vote of at least two-thirds of the NWPTCC's eligible voting members, provided that written notice of the proposed amendment has been received by each member at least seven (7) days prior to the meeting at which the amendment is to be considered and provided that such amendment does not conflict with the letter or fundamental intent of the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) governing this document. In the event of any conflict, the MOU shall carry precedence over these By-Laws.




ACTION ITEM V: NWPRPO PROJECTS FOR SPOT 3.0 SUBMISSION

Dear Ms. Walsh:

The Transportation Planning Branch recently completed a review of the RPO funding process. Based on this review, the Secretary has approved changes to the current RPO funding formula.

The North Carolina Department of Transportation has increased the allocation of Rural Transportation Planning Funds in the amount up to \$92,500 for the Northwest Piedmont RPO for FY 2014. The funds are available based on an 80/20 costs share, and are expected to be matched by a 20% local share, exclusive of any other state funds. Thus, if full funding is available, the total work plan would be \$115,625 (\$92,500 – State, \$23,125 – Local). Reimbursement for planning expenses should be made through the invoice submittal procedure as outlined by the RPO Administrative Procedures. Reimbursements will only be made for transportation planning expenses incurred in executing the work tasks described in your amended FY 2014 Planning Work Program (PWP), which is due by February 10, 2014.

Subject: Guidance For Implementation of Strategic Prioritization - Session Law 2012-84

Session Law 2012-84 amended Section 2 of the General Statutes 136-18 by adding a new subdivision to read:

"The Department shall develop and utilize a process for selection of transportation projects that is based on professional standards in order to most efficiently use limited resources to benefit all citizens of the State. The strategic prioritization process should be a systematic, data-driven process that includes a combination of quantitative data, qualitative input, and multimodal characteristics, and should include local input. The Department shall develop a process for standardizing or approving local methodology used in Metropolitan Planning Organization and Rural Transportation Planning Organization prioritization."

The Department engaged the P3.0 Workgroup to assist in developing guidance on how to implement S.L. 2012-84. The emphasis is on an open and transparent process. On September 30th the Workgroup reached agreement on recommended guidance. The Department agrees.

Outlined below is the guidance each MPO and RPO needs to follow in developing their local methodology. This methodology will be used to assign MPO/RPO local input points under the new Strategic Transportation Investments (STI) law. The Department requests you submit your local methodology for approval and address each of the following items:

- Describe the MPO/RPO ranking process for all modes of transportation that identifies at least one quantitative and one qualitative criteria to be used in the scoring process.
 These criteria should be understandable to the public. In other words, the measures and the percentages assigned to each measure should be defined, described, and outlined in such a way that the public can follow how project points will be assigned.
- Describe how your organization intends to engage and solicit public input on your methodology: i.e., the rationale behind the preliminary assignment of points; posting of this approach on a public website; holding a public hearing to receive comments on the preliminary assignment and/or how your organization followed its public input policies to adhere to this requirement. At least one public review period and public meeting/hearing should be included in the process. This review period needs to allow sufficient time for consideration of any public comments prior to the TCC/TAC making the final point assignment.
- Describe how your Technical Coordinating and Transportation Advisory Committees
 (TCC/TAC) will consider the input of public comments on the preliminary assignment of
 points as they develop and ultimately approve the final point assignment.

- Describe how the final local point assignment (approved by your TAC) will be disseminated and shared with the public. Include dates on your schedule you are targeting to achieve this.
- The methodology needs to be approved by the TAC.

Please develop and submit a proposed methodology, a contact person and/or narrative to Don Voelker, Director, Strategic Prioritization Office of Transportation, as soon as you believe your methodology follows the above guidance. The Department will review each submission and provide a response on its acceptability. We look forward to working with each MPO and RPO to ensure an acceptable methodology is in place before local input points are assigned beginning May 1, 2014; otherwise, the Department will not accept local input points from the MPO/RPO for that area. This lead time should be sufficient for each MPO/RPO to ensure their local methodologies will meet this guidance.
