RE: RFP for Weatherization Assistance Program – Alamance & Caswell Counties

The North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) is soliciting eligible applicants to respond to their Request for Proposals (RFP) for the Weatherization Assistance Program. DENR, once known as the NC Department of Energy, is now located in the Division of Energy, Mineral and Land Resources (DEMLR). The program is funded through the Federal Weatherization Assistance Program Formula Grants, and is awarded by DEMLR to local organizations which perform weatherization services in their designated territory.

The PTRC was awarded the Weatherization Grant in 2012 for Davidson, Forsyth, Guilford, Randolph, and Rockingham counties. Alamance and Caswell counties are existing service delivery areas for the PTRC. It is our intention to submit a proposal for these areas.

RE: Review of Audit Proposals and Recommendation

In February, the full Board voted to allow PTRC to send out Requests for Proposals for new auditing services. Seven firms were solicited and four firms presented proposals. The size of the firms ranged from having four employees to being National firms. The bids ranged from \$22,630 to \$46,400 and the projected hours ranged from 283 to 488.

On April 2, 2014, the Executive Committee made the recommendation to enter into contract with Cannon and Company for audit services. This selection needs to have Board approval and must also be approved by the Local Government Commission.

Listed below are the bids received in response to PTRC's RFPs earlier this year:

Rives and Associates:

- Bid \$22,630
- Hours budgeted 283. Mr. Dolge gave them an opportunity to adjust the amount of hours, however they stood firm with their original estimate.
- Concerns:

 - Smaller towns (Pittsboro, Wake County Schools)
 - o Regional consolidated services

Gibson and Company:

- Bid \$31,450
- Hours budgeted 488
- Concerns:
 - Only four staff members

 - o Smaller towns (Lewisville, Tobaccoville, Walnut Cove)

Cannon and Company:

- Bid \$34,400
- Hours budgeted 460
- Concerns:
 - o Staff turnover
 - Presentation
- Positives:
 - o C.O.G. work (High Country, NWPCOG)

Cherry Bekaert:

- Bid \$46,400
- Hours budgeted 400
- Concerns:
 - o Price
 - o Scope of work
- Positives:
 - o C.O.G. work (Triangle J, PTCOG)
 - o Larger cities (Winston-Salem, Greensboro)
