RE: Request for authorization to submit FY 15-16 renewal contract bids on North Carolina Department of Public Safety for "Treatment for Effective Community Supervision" (TECS) "Recidivism Reduction Services" Program

Under the 2011 Justice Reinvestment Act, the North Carolina Department of Public Safety created funding for the "Treatment for Effective Community Supervision" (TECS) Program. This program supports contracts for local community corrections programs that provide evidence-based cognitive behavioral instruction classes, substance abuse treatment and support services to high-risk/high-need adult probationers.

PTRC will submit bids for renewal contracts in the following counties for services to be provided FY 15-16 through FY 17-18:

Davidson, Davie, Forsyth, Rockingham, Stokes, Surry, Wilkes and Yadkin

The Criminal Justice Department is excited to bring these much-needed services to many of our member counties.

RE: Department of Labor's Face Forward 3 Grant

The following correspondence is a request is to permit the Workforce Development board to participate in the Pre-application process of applying for the Department of Labor's Face Forward 3 Grant. The purpose of the grant is to address employment barriers of court-involved youth while helping them attain in-demand occupational and employment skills needed to obtain good jobs.

The workforce development board will apply for a portion of the grant through the Corps Network and submit a Letter of Interest before April 3rd, 2015. The entire grant is worth \$30.5 million and will be distributed by the Corps Network. This amount will be separated into four grants of \$5 million each to intermediary organizations who will then work with local service providers in no less than three communities across no less than two states. The remaining funds will be awarded to approximately 10 community organizations for up to \$1.05 million each.

The Workforce board is interested in applying these funds towards the Youth program and Service Corps participants. These grants will help individuals move forward into the future by combining the most promising workforce and juvenile justice strategies available.

This opportunity will enhance the workforce boards' ability to serve youth 14-24 years old throughout the Northwest piedmont by providing training and educational services.

The following correspondence is a request is to permit the Workforce Development board to participate in the Pre-application process of applying for the Appalachian Regional Commission grant. The grant will award \$100,000 to a non-construction project related to increasing Job opportunities and Per capita income.

The Workforce board is interested in applying these funds towards a Mobile Simulated Work Environment (SWE). This will be a mobile entity that focuses on improving educational and workforce opportunities, by exposing participants to such skills as Waste reduction, Lean concepts, Team building, and critical thinking. The entire project will cost approximately \$600,000 and is expected to take 240 days.

This opportunity will enhance the workforce boards' ability to serve customers throughout North Carolina by providing a mobile service that enhances training and education.

The workforce development board is requesting approval from the Board of Delegates to apply for the Appalachian Regional Commission Non-construction grant before April 17th, 2015.
