The PTRC has been awarded a \$12,576 205(j) outreach and education grant to educate and inform Eden area stakeholders, landowners and citizens about the planning efforts and "high priority" projects that meet the US EPA's Nine Key Elements of Local Watershed Planning in the Eden Area Watershed Plan. (see: www.ptrc.org/edenareawater). The following are specific deliverables of the proposed outreach and education campaign which will be tailored to the City of Eden and reference the Eden Area Watershed Restoration Plan:

- Four public meetings in Eden (1. Central Area, 2. Draper, 3. Leaksville and 4. Spray)
- Increased citizen volunteers participating in Storm Drain Marking Program, Citizen Water Quality Monitoring (CWQM), Rain Barrel Program, Riparian Buffer Program and Water Protector Program
- Increased awareness, capacity and funding from stakeholders to improve water quality through implementation, education and awareness
