Federal funding has been available to help residents in skilled nursing facilities transition to community living. This process requires a Local Contact Agency (LCA) to respond to a resident's request to discuss with a certified options counselor the possibility of leaving the facility and returning to the community to live and receive services.

This process has taken place at the regional level for the last six years. Last year we subcontracted with two local funded partners for LCA activities and the year before we contracted with three local funded partners. This year one agency (Senior Resources of Guilford) plans to continue providing these activities.

This allocation is an agreed amount with the partnering agency. The amount of \$10,000 is less than the amount provided last year. However, the partnering agency was unable to spend the full allocation in previous years.

Each year after approval by the North Carolina General Assembly, the North Carolina Division of Aging and Adult Services allocates funding to senior centers based on certification status throughout the region. This year's total allocation to Region G is \$240,658, the highest allocation to any region in North Carolina. Our region's allocation is the result of a high number of senior centers who received Center of Excellence or Center of Merit designation.

The attached chart lists all of the senior centers in the region and the proposed contract amount. Of the 26 senior centers in Region G, there are 18 centers of Excellence, 4 centers of Merit, and 4 noncertified centers. The level of certification dictates the amount of Senior Center General Purpose funds allocated to a senior center. The chart reflects the amount by certification and the appropriate match.
