The Planning Department requests to enter into contract for planning services with Davie County in the current and upcoming fiscal year.

Davie County Comprehensive Plan: \$93,500

The following summary of the scope of work describes the project deliverables:

- 1. Review and update existing conditions for water and sewer service areas, voluntary agriculture districts, economic development corridors, cultural features, development limitations, land use, and transportation projects.
- 2. Facilitate public input relating to comprehensive plan recommendations and updates, including blue ribbon committee, municipal staff, focus groups and stakeholders.
- 3. Draft comprehensive plan report and maps and seek adoption. The final plan will include multiple chapters including: Intergovernmental coordination, including linkages to adjoining jurisdiction's land development and transportation plans; Agriculture and farmland preservation; Cultural & arts enhancement; Housing demand and supply; Utilities (water/sewer); Health & wellness (health services, environmental factors, community facilities); Transportation (I-40 corridor analysis and small area plans for key interchanges and transportation nodes as necessary); Recreation, trails & greenways; Comprehensive economic development strategy (CEDS); Land development recommendations; County growth enhancement strategy; and Implementation strategy, including action plan for incorporating key strategies into current and future budgets as well as probably grant funds to support implementation;

The project work will begin in November 2017 and continue through the end of the 2018 calendar year. Davie County is expected to select the Blue Ribbon Committee in November 2018, with a kick-off meeting being held in early December.

The Planning Department requests to enter into contract with the Town of Yanceyville to support administration, environmental assessment, procurement and compliance for a CDBG-I project to upgrade equipment and processes at the Town's Wastewater Treatment Facility. The PTRC supported the \$2,000,000 grant application submission to the Rural Infrastructure Authority in 2016. The Engineer selected through competitive bid to perform engineering services for the project is Allen William Carmen and King.
