- I. Welcome & Conflict of Interest Statement. Mr. Jimmy Blake welcomed those in attendance, reviewed the agenda, opened the meeting, and read the conflict of interest statement. No one indicated any conflict(s) of interest.
- II. Public Comment. Mr. Blake asked for public comment, but no comments were offered.

Items identified in the PWP include the following: continued work on the Prioritization 5.0 process; providing assistance with public transportation planning; collecting of regional data; infrastructure mapping; continuing the Streetscape Assessment program; reviewing and updating of PTRPO administration documents as needed; updating the Public Involvement Plan (PIP); fulfilling federal Title VI requirements; attending relevant conferences and trainings; and funding an RPO internship position. Mr. Alvin Foster made a motion to approve the FY 18-19 Planning Work Program and Mr. Stan Haywood seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

V. FY 18-19 Local Match Amounts. Mr. Larkins presented the final local match amounts for the upcoming fiscal year. He noted that the overall total funding amounts were stable and that there were only minor differences in what each county pays due to changes to population totals. Mr. Jackie Morris made a motion to approve the FY 18-19 Planning Work Program and Mr. David Owen seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Deep River State Trail BUILD Grant Resolution

Background

The PTRC Planning Department is preparing a grant application for the United States Department of Transportation's Better Utilizing Investments to Leverage Development (BUILD) Transportation Discretionary Grant program for Fiscal Year 2018 to fund design, construction, and improvement work along a segment of the Deep River State Trail called the Franklinville-Ramseur Connector.

BUILD vs TIGER Fact Sheet

The Better Utilizing Investments to Leverage Development (BUILD) Transportation Grants solicitation will make \$1.5 billion available to surface transportation projects that align with the merit criteria described in the Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO). BUILD replaces the pre-existing TIGER grants program. Like TIGER, FY 2018 BUILD Transportation Grants are for investments in surface transportation infrastructure and are to be awarded on a competitive basis for projects that will have a significant local or regional impact. For this round of BUILD, no more than \$150 million can be awarded to a single State.

To reflect the Administration's Infrastructure Initiative, DOT plans to award a greater share of BUILD Transportation funding to projects located in rural areas that align well with the merit criteria than to those in urban areas. Rural applicants can highlight their needs in response to several of the evaluation criteria, including to deploy rural broadband as part of an eligible transportation project. BUILD encourages local governments to proactively raise new sources of revenue with a new criterion to evaluate local activities to generate additional non-Federal revenue for transportation infrastructure.

BUILD applications will be evaluated based on the following merit criteria: safety, economic competitiveness, quality of life, environmental protection, state of good repair, innovation, partnership, and additional non-Federal revenue for infrastructure investments. Below is a side-by-side comparison of the merit criteria used in TIGER and BUILD:

WHEREAS, the project, when completed, will support RPO and multi-jurisdictional planning efforts, in accordance with FAST Act requirements, to develop an intermodal transportation system providing consideration for all modes of transportation; and

WHEREAS, Randolph County is preparing a grant application for the United States Department of Transportation's Better Utilizing Investments to Leverage Development (BUILD) Transportation Discretionary Grants program for Fiscal Year 2018 to fund the design, construction, and improvement of the Franklinville-Ramseur Connector of the Deep River State Trail within the County.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved, the Piedmont Triad Rural Planning Organization Transportation Advisory Committee supports Randolph County's US BUILD grant application for the development of the Franklinville-Ramseur Connector of the Deep River State Trail.
