A. Presentations

1. "Focus on Members – Alamance County", by Craig Honeycutt, Manager

This month's focus on a PTRC members was Alamance County. Mr. Honeycutt presented a PowerPoint slide show on the history of Alamance County.

2. "NC Tomorrow Initiatives", by Betty Huskins, President, Ridgetop Associates

Ms. Huskins stated that the NC Tomorrow First Initiative is to conduct a Statewide Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) across North Carolina. These regionally significant Economic Development Strategies will serve as the foundation to create a relevant NC Tomorrow Sustainable Economic Strategic Plan. This Strategic Plan will be the primary source for the creation of the NC Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (NC CEDS) that will serve as a blueprint for creating an economically sustainable economy for North Carolina.

She stated that the Statewide CEDS can serve as a "blueprint" for growth and development based on common-sense, sustainable best practices and "one version of the truth" provided by data collection and analysis from the SAS Institute. The SSAS Institute is developing software specifically for the initiative, North Carolina Regional Economic Prosperity Strategy (REPS). REPS will be a "tool" fur use by planning professionals, economic development professionals, elected officials and private industry developers. REPS will be housed at the SAS Institute in Cary at their World Headquarters in the Institute for State and Local Government that was established in 2010.

3. Request for approval of resolutions to establish a Flexible Benefits Plan and Health Reimbursement Arrangement – Matt Reece, PTRC Administration & Member Services Director

Mr. Reece stated that as a part of the approved benefits plan for the PTRC there is a flexible benefit plan and health reimbursement arrangement. The health reimbursement arrangement (HRA) is a key component to the delivery of the Regional Council's health care plan. Both Councils of Governments previously had a flexible benefit plans. The plans were different but overall allowed the employer and employees to pre-tax a variety of items such as dependent health care premiums, miscellaneous medical expenses, and dependent care expenses. These plans comply with various sections of the Internal Revenue Code. Board adoption of the attached resolutions is needed authorize and establish the flexible benefit plan and the HRA in the name of the Piedmont Triad Regional Council.

Mr. Reece recommended approval of the following resolutions so that the PTRC may establish a flexible benefit plan and health reimbursement arrangement.

ADOPTION RESOLUTION FLEXIBLE BENEFIT PLAN OF Piedmont Triad Regional Council

Whereas, Piedmont Triad Regional Council, a NC based government entity (hereinafter "the Council"), by resolution, authorizes the adoption of this Flexible Benefit Plan; and

Whereas, this Plan is intended to comply with the provisions of Sections 79, 105, 106, 125, and 129 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended; and

Whereas, the Council has retained ProBenefits, Inc. as plan service provider (hereinafter "Plan Service Provider"), to whom it will delegate certain administrative duties;

Now, therefore:

- 1. This resolution is intended to approve and incorporate by reference the Plan Document, a copy of which is being separately approved by the Council. The plan shall be known as the Piedmont Triad Regional Council Flexible Benefit Plan ("the Plan"). To the extent that this resolution conflicts with the Plan Document, the Plan Document shall control and supersede the provisions contained herein.
- 2. Effective 7/30/2011, each eligible employee of the Council shall have the option, in accordance with the provisions of the Plan, to receive from the Council such benefits as are more particularly set forth in the Plan Document and incorporated herein by reference.
- 3. Each eligible employee of the Council, upon request, shall be given a copy of the Plan upon first becoming eligible.
- 4. This Plan shall remain in effect until amended or revoked by the Council, and written notice of any such amendment or revocation shall be promptly given to eligible employees.
- 5. This Plan is for the exclusive benefit of eligible employees of the Council and their eligible dependents. It is intended that this Plan shall be a plan qualified within the meaning of Sections 105 and 125 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the officers of the Council are authorized and directed to take any and all actions necessary or appropriate to fully effectuate the provisions and intentions of this Plan.

Rul. 2002-41 (June 26, 2002) and IRS Notice 2002-45 (June 26, 2002), and

Whereas, the Organization has retained ProBenefits, Inc. as plan service provider (hereinafter "Plan Service Provider"), to whom it will delegate certain administrative duties;

Now, therefore:

- 1. This resolution is intended to approve and incorporate by reference the Plan Document, a copy of which is attached. The plan shall be known as the Piedmont Triad Regional Council Health Reimbursement Arrangement ("the Plan"). To the extent that this resolution conflicts with the Plan Document, the Plan Document shall control and supersede the provisions contained herein.
- 2. Effective July 1, 2011, each eligible employee of the Organization shall have the option, in accordance with the provisions of the Plan, to receive from the Organization such benefits as are more particularly set forth in the Plan Document and incorporated herein by reference.
- 3. Each eligible employee of the Organization, upon request, shall be given a copy of the Plan upon first becoming eligible.
- 4. This Plan shall remain in effect until amended or revoked by the Board of Directors, and written notice of any such amendment or revocation shall be promptly given to eligible employees.
- 5. This Plan is for the exclusive benefit of eligible employees of the Organization and their eligible dependents. The officers of this Organization are authorized and directed to take any and all actions necessary or appropriate to fully effectuate the provisions and intentions of this Plan.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Organization has caused this Plan to be declared and approved by its proper officers effective as of July 1, 2011.

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4. Request for approval of participation in the Local Governmental Employees Retirement System – Matt Reece

As a part of the approved benefits plan the PTRC is a participation in the Local Governmental Employees Retirement System (LGERS). Both Councils of Governments previously participated in the LGERS and allowed contributions to be made in tax sheltered status and provided a death benefit.

Mr. Reece requested Board adoption of the following resolutions to authorize and establish the same level of participation in the LGERS for the Piedmont Triad Regional Council.

WHEREAS, the 1969 General Assembly amended the North Carolina Local Governmental Employees' Retirement System laws so as to permit agreements for providing death benefits for employee members pursuant to G.S. 128-27(1); and

WHEREAS, the governing body if this Unit realizes the desirability of providing its employees with the security and protection provided by a plan for death benefits; and

WHEREAS, Article 3 of Chapter 128 of the General Statutes of North Carolina provides that any employer governmental unit desiring to provide death benefits for its employee members must execute an agreement therefore with the Director of the North Carolina Local Governmental Employees' Retirement System:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Board of Delegates in regular session,

- That the <u>Piedmont Triad Regional Council</u> hereby elects to secure death benefits for its employees in the North Carolina Local Governmental Employees' Retirement System.
- 2. That the <u>Piedmont Triad Regional Council</u> hereby agrees to comply with all provisions of the North Carolina Local Governmental Employees' Retirement System as defined in Article3, Chapter 128 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, as amended, and to make such increased employer's contributions as the Local Governmental Employees' Retirement System may determine to be necessary in order to provide employee death benefits.
- 3. That the <u>Executive Director</u> is hereby ordered and directed to execute an agreement with the Director of North Carolina Local Governmental Employees' Retirement System to implement the employee death benefits of G.S. 128-27(1).

AGREEMENT - DEATH BENEFIT

In accordance with the provisions of subsection (1)of G.S. 128-27 setting forth the
conditions under which the rights of the death benefit might be made available to members of

and the Director of said Retirement System.
In consideration of an increase ofin the employer's
contribution rate effective as of <u>July 1, 2011</u> , the North Carolina Local Governmental Employees'
Retirement System hereby agrees to extend the privileges and rights of the death benefit
described in subsection (1) of G.S. 128-27 to the employee of the Piedmont Triad Regional
(local governmental unit) Council who are members of said System on and after the above effective date. This
Agreement shall continue in effect from year to year with the understanding that the rate
payable for this death benefit may be modified as the System's Actuary may periodically
determine.
Approval of the above increase in rate was authorized by Piedmont Triad Regional (tax governing board)

RESOLUTION TO ENACT A TAX SHELTER OF EMPLOYEES' CONTRIBUTIONS PAYABLE AS MEMBERS OF THE NORTH CAROLINA LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM

WHEREAS, the 1981 Session (1982 Regular Session) of the North Carolina General Assembly, by a duly ratified bill effective July 1, 1982, enacted North Carolina General Statute 128-30(b1), a copy of which is attached hereto, which under the conditions specified therein permits an employer participating in the North Carolina Local Governmental Employees' Retirement System to tax shelter the contributions payable to this System by its employees who are members of this System; and,

WHEREAS, this employer is an employee participating in the North Carolina Local Governmental Employees' Retirement System with respect to its eligible employees; and

WHEREAS, this employer deems it desirable to tax shelter the contributions payable by its employees as members of the North Carolina Local Governmental Employees' Retirement System.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE <u>Board of Delegates</u> in regular session, that as of <u>August 17th, 2011</u> the <u>Piedmont Triad Regional Council</u> elects pursuant to the provision of North Carolina General Statute 12/-30(b1) to pick up and pay to the North Carolina Local Governmental Employees' Retirement System the contributions which would be otherwise payable to this System by its employees who are members of this System and to treat in all respects such contributions in the manner specified in said North Carolina General Statute 128-30(b1).

NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL STATUTE 128-30(b1)

'(b1) Pick Up of Employee Contributions. --- Anything within this section to the contrary notwithstanding, effective July 1, 1982, an employer, pursuant to the provisions of Section 414(h)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended, may elect to pick up and pay the contributions which would be payable by the employees as members under subsection (b) of this section with respect to the service of employees after June 30, 1982.

The members' contributions picked up by an employer shall be designated for all purposes of the Retirement System as member contributions, except for the determination of tax upon a distribution from the System. These contributions shall be credited to the annuity savings fund and accumulated within the fund in a member's account which shall be separately established for the purpose of accounting for picked-up contributions.

Members contributions picked up by an employer shall be payable from the same source funds used for the payment of compensation to a member. A deduction shall be made from a member's compensation equal to the amount of his contributions picked up by his employer. This deduction, however, shall not reduce his compensation as defined in subdivision (7a) of G.S. 128-21. Picked-up contributions shall be transmitted to the System monthly for the preceding month by means of a warrant drawn by the employer and payable to the Local Governmental Employees' Retirement System and shall be accompanied by a schedule of the pick-up contributions on such forms as may be prescribed. In the case of a failure to fulfill these conditions the provisions of subsection (f)(3) of this section shall apply."

5. Request for approval of a Second Chance Grant Award in the amount of \$190,000 to provide staff support and employability skills training to former offenders and approval to accept Project Re-Entry Contract in the amount of \$14,450— Althea Hariston, PTRC Workforce Development Director

Ms. Hairston stated that TriadWorks received Second Chance Grant Award in the amount of \$190,000 to provide staff support and employability skills training to former offenders. She stated that this is a regional initiative that will serve former offenders in Forsyth, Guilford, Davidson and Randolph Counties.

Ms. Hairston also stated that the Northwest Piedmont Council of Governments has been approved to be awarded \$14,450 for the Project Re-entry beginning July 1, 2011.

Motion was made by Mr. Austin, seconded by Mr. Lankford, and carried unanimously to approve the Second Change Grant Award in the amount of \$190,000 to provide staff support and employability skills training to former offenders and approval to accept Project Re-Entry Contract in the amount of \$14,450.

6. Request for permission to receive NC DENR Funding – Paul Kron, PTRC Planning Director

Mr. Kron stated that in 2010 the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) pledged \$10,000 per year for three years to provide matching funds for a federal Housing and Urban Development (HUD) *Sustainable Communities Planning* grant. HUD awarded our region \$1.3 million in the fall of 2010 for a 3-year project to develop a regional plan to integrate economic development, housing and transportation investments.

In January 2011, PTCOG completed a regional land supply analysis for the Land and Infrastructure Committee of the Piedmont Triad Partnership Aerotropolis Leadership Board. Using GIS technology, county tax parcel data was analyzed to identify the top 300 potential "greenfield" development sites in the 12-county region currently zoned for industrial uses and containing over 7,000 acres of undeveloped land. One of the project gaps was the identification of underutilized in-fill and brownfield redevelopment opportunities in communities throughout the region.

The Piedmont Authority for Regional Transportation (PART) is the named recipient of the HUD grant, on behalf of a large consortium of partners. Based on conversations with these regional partners DENR will provide its funding to the Piedmont Triad Regional Council (PTRC) to conduct an inventory of in-fill and brownfield redevelopment opportunities in communities throughout the region.

Mr. Kron requested authorization to receive DENR funds in support of our ongoing regional planning efforts.

Motion was made by Ms. Peggy Leight, seconded by Mr. McDermon, and carried unanimously to authorize the PTRC staff to receive DENR funds in support of ongoing regional planning efforts.
