Welcome

- I. Welcome & Conflict of Interest Statement. Mr. Jimmy Blake welcomed those in attendance, reviewed the agenda, opened the meeting, and read the conflict of interest statement. No one indicated any conflict(s) of interest.
- II. Public Comment. Mr. Blake asked for public comment, but no comments were offered.

III. Montgomery County Overview. Mr. Mark Scott presented on the current successes and challenges regarding economic development in Montgomery County.

- IV. April 18, 2018 Meeting Minutes. Mr. Blake shared the meeting minutes with the group. Mr. Mark Richardson made a motion to approve the minutes from the April 18, 2018, meeting and Mr. David Fernandez seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- V. P5.0 Regional Impact Point Assignments. Mr. Larkins presented the completed scoring for projects in the Regional Impact category. He also noted that at the request of Division 7 that project H090229 in Caswell County involving the widening of NC 86 from Yanceyville to the Virginia State line be given the maximum number of points. It was noted that this was outside of the official Prioritization methodology for the RPO and would have to be approved by the TAC before becoming official. Mr. Richardson made a motion to approve the deviation from the methodology and the final PTRPO project scores and point assignments in the Regional Impact category. Mr. Alvin Foster seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- VI. Deep River State Trail BUILD Grant Resolution. Mr. Larkins noted that the PTRC Planning Department is preparing a grant application for the United States Department of Transportation's Better Utilizing Investments to Leverage Development (BUILD) Transportation Discretionary Grant program for the Fiscal Year 2018 to fund design, construction, and improvement work along a segment of the Deep River State Trail called the Franklinville-Ramseur Connector. Mr. Greg Patton made a motion to approve the BUILD grant resolution and Mr. Fernandez seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- VII. Amendment of Current FY Planning Work Program. Mr. Larkins noted that the current Planning Work Program needs amending to adjust four funding categories. As with past amendments, the total funding amount will stay the same. Mr. Richardson made a motion to approve the amendments to the current FY Planning Work Program and Mr. Alvin Foster seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Re: Draft Prioritization 5.0 Division Needs Point Assignments

The PTRPO has completed the scoring of projects in the Division Needs category following the approved methodology and local input from each of the four counties.

As written in the methodology, the PTRPO has Flex Points available that are points that not automatically assigned through the scoring process. The purpose of Flex Points are "to recognize projects that demonstrate significant need, yet did not receive local input points in other categories." The starting number of Flex Points available is 400. During this round of Prioritization 200 additional points were added making the total number to 600.

After an examination of the PTRPO's top scoring projects, those selected by Division 7 and Division 8, and information collected during the four county meetings, 500 Flex Points were assigned to five (5) highway projects. This leaves 100 open points to be assigned by the TAC & TCC at the October 17 meeting to any project not already receiving points.

The following sheet is a draft summary of the point assignments for each mode. Flex Point assignments are highlighted in red.

Resolution Supporting City of Eden Grant Application

Background

The City of Eden is applying for the 2019 round of NCDOT's Bicycle and Pedestrian Planning Grant Initiative. This resolution of support from the RPO will be included in their grant application.

The NCDOT Division of Bicycle and Pedestrian Transportation and the Transportation Planning Branch created an annual matching grant program – the Bicycle and Pedestrian Planning Grant Initiative – to encourage municipalities to develop comprehensive bicycle plans and pedestrian plans. This program was initiated in January 2004 and is currently administered through NCDOT-DBPT.

The Planning Grant Initiative has been successful in its fourteen years - since 2004, 193 planning grants have been awarded. To date, a total of approximately \$5.5 million has been allocated to 190 municipalities and three counties through this grant program.

Summary of Amendments

In March of 2018, the Piedmont Triad Rural Planning Organization (PTRPO) requested from the Transportation Planning Division of the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) to amend the 2012 Montgomery County Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP). The mode of transportation evaluated as part of this amendment only included the highway network. Refer to the original 2012 Montgomery County CTP adopted on March 8, 2012 by NCDOT for all other related information. This plan does not cover routine maintenance or minor operations issues.

- NC 24-27: Revise the CTP designation of NC 24-27 from the Moore County line to US 73/74 from "Expressway - Needs Improvement" to "Boulevard - Needs Improvement".
- NC 24-27: Revise the CTP designation of NC 24-27 from US 73/74 to Coggins Road (SR 1336) from "Expressway - Needs Improvement" to "Other Major Thoroughfares - Needs Improvement".

Town of Candor

- US 220A (N Main Street): Revise the CTP designation of US 220A from W Ewing Street (end of median) to S Whiskey Road (near Town Hall) from "Other Major Thoroughfares Existing" to "Other Major Thoroughfares Needs Improvement".
- NC 211: Revise the CTP designation of NC 211 from the Moore County line to US 73/74 from "Expressway Needs Improvement" to "Boulevard Needs Improvement".

Town of Mt. Gilead

- NC 73: Revise the CTP designation of NC 73 through the town core from "Other Major Thoroughfares - Existing" to "Other Major Thoroughfares - Needs Improvement".
- NC 109: Revise the CTP designation of NC 109 from NC 731 to Hearne Farm Road (SR 1127) from "Other Major Thoroughfares - Existing" to "Other Major Thoroughfares - Needs Improvement".

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• NC 731: Revise the CTP designation of NC 73 from Park Avenue to NC 109 from "Other Major Thoroughfares - Existing" to "Other Major Thoroughfares - Needs Improvement".

• NC 24-27: Revise the CTP designation of NC 24-27 from Page Street (SR 1332) to Dogwood Avenue from "Other Major Thoroughfares - Existing" to "Other Major Thoroughfares - Needs Improvement".
