Regional Food System Network learnings (Gini)

- <u>Chesapeake Foodshed Network</u>, is a regional food system initiative, rooted in the Chesapeake Bay watershed.
- They have a very dedicated funder who really believes in this work, and been their primary funder from the beginning. Overall, they are jointly funded by 7 foundations.
- CFN provides \$2K stipends to the steering committee, co-chairs \$5K with much bigger commitment. Wanted to make sure to value their time and make sure they knew it was more than a board, more work.
- They are paying co-chairs and steering committee, because they want equity to be front and center, and this not be a traditional structure of an Executive Director and Board. The committees and co-chairs all have leadership roles and take part in the work, not just showing up for meetings.
- They meet 6x a year, two of those meetings are overnight.
- They are possibly rethinking this model of shared leadership maybe a stipend based on contribution.
- In addition to the Steering Committee, they have Work Groups (Farm to Institution, Equity, and Food Waste & Recovery) and an Action Team.

Thoughts about stipends for co-chairs

- *Helps sustain attention & catalyze ideas
- Would need to set up a reporting schedule, and could use this to ramp up work
- *Good for individuals
- Would need clear expectations
- Never been a part of a committee that has stipends
- Some would be ineligible due to job requirements (gov't, county positions)
- NADTC grant uses this idea in a way

Thoughts on Shared Gifting

- Are part of a network and able to contribute
- Works like self-insurance, accountability
- Encourages/incentivizes involvement
- Makes granting participatory and not just reporting
- Helps expand ideas that work, sharing lessons learned
- What is being done locally to reach regional goals?
 - Regional food assessment

2019 Action Planning

- Review past work.
- Circle of influence: Elected officials, food council leaders, gov't agencies, foundations & funders
- Top measure to track our work:
 - Food Councils are funded, resourced (x5)
 - Local food impacts incorporated into planning decisions (x3)
 - Each county has a food council, or representation on the regional food council (x3)
- Potential actions:
 - 7 Regional Food Assessment Move this forward, researching the elements, different models, and firms to request RFP submission
 - 7 Build the network by connecting with all counties in the Triad, particularly those without food councils
 - Consider each county's health promotion coordinator and economic developers
 - 6 Hire staff or find resources to collect, compile, and aggregate data to share and enhance credibility
 - 6 Create/finalize our communications pitch who we are, what we do, etc
 - 4 Secure funding for the assessment

- 4 Work with students and class projects to make food and agriculture connections with planning documents
- o 3 Research and further develop strategies and actions (stipends, shared gifting, etc)
- 3 Coordinate local food celebration events
- 2 Connect food and agriculture in regional economic development plans to local econ.
 Development plans.
 - Share this information and invite local economic developers to have a conversation about benefits of local food and farming
- 1 Research funding mechanisms to support local gov't in including health, food, and farming in their comprehensive plans
