The EDA has invited the Piedmont Triad Regional Development Corporation to apply for a single supplemental financial assistance award with two components: (1) up to \$2,020,000 to capitalize a new RLF to alleviate sudden and severe economic dislocation caused by the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic to serve the same lending area as your existing RLF award and (2) up to an additional ten percent of that amount to defray administrative costs necessary to establish the new RLF and to facilitate rapid and prudent lending to respond to the pandemic (the ten percent for administrative costs is in addition to, not a portion of, the funds used to capitalize the RLF).
